Berkshire Junior Netball League

The 2025/26 season has been another successful year for junior netball across Berkshire, providing competitive and developmental opportunities for young players throughout the county.

This season, 20 junior clubs and 105 teams participated across age groups from U10 to U19, with over 800 fixtures hosted at six indoor venues across Berkshire. The continued success of the league relies on the dedication of our volunteers, coaches, officials and committee members, whose commitment provides a valuable and enjoyable introduction to competitive netball for hundreds of young players.

A key development this year was the introduction of the League Republic administration platform. This investment has significantly streamlined league administration and improved the recording and publication of results across BJNL, National Schools and the Berkshire Premier Netball League (BPNL).

Although the Winter and Summer Leagues collectively recorded an estimated loss of approximately £1,500, they continue to provide opportunities for over 800 junior netballers across the county. Berkshire Premier Netball League

Berkshire Netball has continued to support the development of the Berkshire Premier Netball League. Through representation on the BPNL committee, Berkshire Netball has assisted with venue provision and fixture management, while also integrating BPNL fixtures and information onto the Berkshire Netball website to improve visibility and engagement.

National Schools Competition

The National Schools County Competition was held in the autumn at Theale Green School, with 32 teams competing across the U14, U16 and U19 age groups. We continue to support state schools by offering a full bursary for the tournament entry fee.
